No more monitoring for 5 years!! We will hopefully have some progress with the speed watch co-ordination with Burton Fleming.

I attended Parish Open Door meet and greet event in Driffield in January. It was really useful to discuss issues face to face with relevant people. Would recommend attending future events.

I hope to focus more effort on the Village Green and surrounds in coming 12 months; finding leak in pond and smartening up bus stop, boat, picnic tables area. More later in ordinary meeting
