ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 SECTION 14 (1)

TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC

Fordon Road, Wold Newton and Fordon Lane, Fordon

Notice is hereby given that The East Riding of Yorkshire Council intends not less than seven days from the date of this notice to make an Order, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along Fordon Road, Wold Newton - full extent and Fordon Lane, Fordon from Burton Fleming Road to o/s High Fordon Farm commencing 17th November 2025 @ 08:00 hours for the purpose of "excavate to install approx. 2000m telecoms duct to link into existing telecoms apparatus".

The closures will be carried out in three phases

- Phase 1 Between the junctions of Front Street to North Coates Road
- Phase 2 Between the junctions of North Cotes Road to Fordon Lane
- Phase 3 From the junction of Burton Fleming Road to o/s High Fordon Farm

The alternative routes for traffic affected by the road closures will be via:

- Phase 1: Fordon Road, North Cotes Road and B1249
- Phase 2: North Cotes Road, B1249, Fordon Lane
- Phase 3: Butt Lane, B1249, North Cotes Lane

The road closure is necessary to enable the works to be carried out in a manner consistent with ensuring the safety of the public. The Order is valid for 18 months, but it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 21st November @ 18:00 hours.

The diversion route will be signed at the time of closure. The road will be closed to all traffic but access will be maintained for emergency vehicles, residents and pedestrians.
