Drugs Use and Dealing – Ongoing Priority

We continue to review and develop intelligence around drugs misuse and supply within Driffield and surrounding areas. We have actively targeted vehicles and carry out a number of stop searches on individuals that have produced positive results.

We continue to work with licenced premises carrying out visits and incorporating the use of pub watch and banning notices to target individuals linked to drug misuse. Using a passive drugs dog twice over the last month has yielded some positive results and been welcomed by the local community.

We ask that you continue to report concerns around drug misuse / dealing at the time.

Shop Theft

There has been an increase in thefts from local supermarkets. We will continue to work with shop staff to identify offenders and review all investigative options.

A further link to shop theft and local school pupils has been identified. We continue to work with school staff to identify those involved, deal positively and educate.

As part of Op-Yellowfin we have trained officers on off road motorcycles that continue to patrol and educate riders on safe riding as well as deter general crime and vehicle ASB



Force News

Three 'violent thugs' who have admitted to causing harm and destruction during a demonstration in Hull on Saturday 3 August have been sentenced to a total of seven years eight months in prison at Hull Crown Court today (Friday 9 August).

Andrew Stewart, 37-years-old, of Anlaby Road in Hull was charged with violent disorder in connection with the incident. He pleaded guilty at an earlier court hearing and has received two and a half years in prison.

Brandon Kirkwood, 20-years-old, of Downing Grove in Hull was charged with violent disorder and pleaded guilty to the offence. He has been given two and a half years in prison.

Christoper Douglas, 35-years-old, of Avenues Court in Hull was charged with violent disorder and pleaded guilty. He has been handed a two year, eight month sentence.

Assistant Chief Constable Thom McLoughlin said: "All three of these violent thugs were on a mission to cause fear and disruption last weekend.

"Stewart was seen catapulting a large, ignited bin, as well as hurling missiles towards police officers.

"Kirkwood was also responsible for pushing bins and throwing multiple objects towards police officers, whilst Douglas was heavily involved in the disorder, throwing items at, and pushing police officers, and acting aggressively as part of a large group of what can only be described as hooligans.

Arrested following the disorder in Hull City Centre on Saturday 3 August. include:

- A 41-year-old man who was arrested on suspicion of violent disorder.
- A 26-year-old man who was arrested on suspicion of two counts of burglary, criminal damage and possession of class B drugs.
- A 13-year-old boy who was arrested on suspicion of violent disorder.
- A 13-year-old boy who was arrested on suspicion of violent disorder and affray.
- A third 13-year-old boy who was arrested on suspicion of burglary.

They have since been released under investigation whilst enquiries continue.

On Friday 9 August, the Rural Task Force, in partnership with our Roads Policing Team, Community Teams, East Riding of Yorkshire Council Waste Management Team and the National Caravan Council Vehicle Examiners joined forces in a day of action conducting roadside checks as part of Operation Coastline.

A total of 32 vehicle checks were made resulting in drugs being seized, a traffic offence record issued for an insecure load, and one DVLA ticket issued for failing to notify DVLA of change of keeper.

A 31-year-old man was also arrested on suspicion of driving whilst under the influence of drugs and has since been released on bail pending further investigation.

Operation Coastline launched on Monday 22 July ahead of the summer holidays as our coastal and market towns started to see an influx of tourists to the area.

Members of the public can expect to see officers from our local Neighbourhood Policing Teams, Rural Task Force, Op Yellowfin, Patrol, and our Community Safety Unit out and about conducting high visibility patrols, with a continued focus on engaging with those in the area to ensure our communities are safe from crime.

Superintendent Paul Butler, leading the operation said: "We have been targeting our resources effectively to disrupt all types of criminal activity and members within our community have seen an increased presence of officers across the area, patrolling hotspot locations, and speaking to people to provide reassurance.

"We know that when the public acts as our extra eyes and ears, it helps us keep those attending our area safe from criminality, and we would always encourage you to report any offences to us so we can build the bigger picture and take action. Please speak to our officers when you see them out and about, or you can report any concerns or suspicious behaviour via our non-emergency number 101.

"You can also report information anonymously to the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111."







